



Post-Doctoral Fellowship

The University of British Columbia Department of Psychiatry invites applications for a full-time Post-Doctoral Fellow in the area of neuropsychology of severe mental illness (psychotic and mood disorders).

The primary areas of research will include investigation of clinical neuropsychological functioning in individuals presenting with treatment resistant psychosis, as well as investigation of cognitive and metacognitive functioning in these and related clinical populations. Opportunities are also available for collaboration and work in the areas of cognitive remediation, neurostimulation, and other related specialties within the department. Fellows will contribute to ongoing studies and develop independent projects from existing databases, obtain experience in grant-writing and securing research funds, and may develop prospective research projects.

Suitable applicants will have a Ph.D. in clinical neuropsychology and clinical psychology, strong statistical analysis and writing skills, and interest in a career as a clinical researcher. The fellowship has an anticipated start date of September 1, 2023, with an initial term of one year with opportunity for extension. The fellowship will be based at UBC Hospital on the main UBC campus.
