# Selections

The Forensic Psychiatry Subspecialty Program will be following the nation-wide match. The match process is a collegial approach that impacts all candidates and programs. It involves applicants providing their rankings to the nationally coordinating Program Director, and the UBC Program Director determining the ranking. Positions will be matched based on the matching algorithm. We held a 2<sup>nd</sup> round of Selections.

I am happy to share that Dr. Shuying Zheng has accepted an offer (in addition to Dr. Edwin Chow who was the successful candidate of the 1<sup>st</sup> round) and will be starting her residency with our Program on July 1, 2024.



# Accreditation

The Forensic Psychiatry Subspecialty Program has received an official status of Accredited Program with Follow-Up by Action Plan Outcomes Report (APOR) (due 2026). We thank everyone for their hard work, collegiality and collaboration in making this accreditation status attainable.

As we have received an **APOR** status, follow-up requires submission of evidence to the Royal College demonstrating that the identified AFI-2Y have been addressed, due by <u>May 31, 2026</u>. In order to ensure that our program has sufficient time to implement these plans, our completed preliminary proposal should be returned to the PGME Accreditation Team no later than Friday, May 3, 2025.

We will reach out as necessary to relevant parties to ensure successful completion of the document.

# Continuous Quality Improvement



This quarter our CQI focus is on Program Organization. Specifically, we are examining **Standard 3**: Residents are prepared for independent practice. Elements include ensuring educational design is based on competencies and/or objectives and educational experiences which facilitate residents' attainment of competencies and/or objectives.

To review that 2) educational experiences facilitate residents' attainment of competencies and/or objectives, we can review documents related to increasing professional responsibility and scholarly activity.
