Accreditation

The Forensic Psychiatry Subspecialty Program has received an official status of Accredited Program with Follow-Up by Action Plan Outcomes Report **(APOR)** (due 2026). We thank everyone for their hard work, collegiality and collaboration in making this accreditation status attainable.

As we have received an **APOR** status, follow-up requires submission of evidence to the Royal College demonstrating that the identified AFI-2Y have been addressed, due by <u>May 31, 2025. In order to ensure that our program has sufficient time</u> to implement these plans, our completed preliminary proposal should be returned to the PGME Accreditation Team no later than Friday, May 3, 2025.

We will reach out as necessary to relevant parties to ensure successful completion of the document.
